The Role:

A.E.W. Limited Partnership (A.E.W. LP) is seeking a full-time on-going Social Impact Assessment Specialist based out of beautiful Kamloops, BC, or the Lower Mainland. This is a remote to semi-remote position depending on the candidate's preference. The Social Impact Assessment Specialist is a member of the Impact Assessment Team who develops the portion of the Impact Assessment related to socioeconomics and cultural effects for various types of projects. Reporting to the Natural Resources Manager, the Social Impact Assessment Specialist will:

- Foster engagement and participation in community outreach and consultation initiatives.
- Ensure meticulous maintenance of thorough and accurate communication records.
- Create concise meeting notes to aid in identifying, tracking, and addressing issues.
- Assist in assembling materials for community engagement activities and events.
- Undertake background research and analysis responsibilities.
- Incorporate social, economic, and Indigenous knowledge into impact assessment frameworks.
- Assist in generating high-quality reports.
- Support the preparation and composition of proposals.
- Actively participate in company meetings and events.
- Support advancement of Nlaka'pamux jurisdiction by making recommendations for new policies, plans, and standards over and above Federal and Provincial regulations and standards.

Requirements:

- An undergraduate or graduate degree in a relevant science or social science field.
- Familiar with the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP)
- Knowledge of BC provincial and/or federal environmental assessment legislations and process is an asset.
- 5-8 years of experience in social, economic and Indigenous effects assessments
