Why Work with Us?

A.E.W. LP is guided by a commitment to uphold Nlaka'pamux rights and environmental integrity. You will directly contribute to projects that respect and reinforce Nlaka'pamux values. We foster a supportive team environment where all voices are valued, and knowledge sharing is encouraged. We offer flexible work arrangements, including opportunities to work from home, and a strong emphasis on maintaining a healthy work-life balance with a competitive compensation package:

- Annual salary range of \$70,000 – \$80,000 plus overtime.
- Paid vacation plus approximately five additional paid days during the holiday season

The Role:

A.E.W. Limited Partnership (A.E.W. LP) is seeking a full-time one-year term Environmental Inspector, on 14 days on 7 days off schedule, in Kamloops, BC with the option for an additional year extension. The Environmental Inspector ensures project compliance with environmental legislation, permits, and sustainability objectives by conducting site inspections, monitoring activities, and coordinating with lead environmental personnel. The role includes overseeing compliance related to water, soil, and waste, preparing reports and audits, mentoring staff, and working with project teams to address environmental issues and support continuous improvement in environmental performance and will:

- Conduct environmental inspections for projects in the mining industry
- Ensure compliance with applicable environmental regulations, permits, and project commitments throughout pipeline construction and operations
- Provide environmental guidance to construction personnel, including recommendations on weather-related shutdowns and responses to unforeseen environmental conditions
- Serve as a liaison between construction personnel and lead environmental inspectors
- Oversee and verify implementation of Environmental Protection Plans (EPPs) and Environmental Management Plans (EMPs) during construction activities



- Recommend and support the application of best management practices and mitigation measures to address environmental risks
- Monitor topsoil stripping, segregation, replacement, and site reclamation activities, including seeding
- Recommend appropriate erosion and sediment control measures and oversee their installation and effectiveness
- Supervise watercourse and waterbody crossing activities to ensure compliance with regulatory approvals and project specifications
- Monitor water diversion and withdrawal activities to ensure regulatory compliance
- Perform equipment inspections to identify potential fluid leaks and support spill prevention and response efforts
- Prepare daily environmental inspection reports, environmental summaries, and post-construction environmental reports
- Participate in project coordination and safety meetings
- Other duties as assigned.

Requirements:

- Bachelor's degree or technical diploma in biology, forestry, agriculture, environmental science, or a related discipline
- Membership in good standing, or eligibility for membership, with an appropriate professional regulatory organization (e.g., RPBio.) in compliance with the *Professional Governance Act*.
- Minimum of two years of relevant experience in environmental inspection and monitoring for development projects in Western Canada
- Demonstrated knowledge and hands-on experience with large-scale construction projects
- Possession of a valid driver's license

What makes you exceptional:

- Demonstrated knowledge and hands-on experience with large-scale construction projects
- Comprehensive understanding of applicable provincial and federal environmental legislation, regulations, and policies to ensure project-specific compliance
- Proficient in the use, operation, and maintenance of standard environmental field equipment
- Ability to quickly identify, assess, and mitigate environmental issues within an active construction environment
- Strong analytical, problem-solving, and decision-making skills
- Effective verbal and written communication skills for interacting with clients, contractors, regulatory agencies, and team members
- Demonstrated ability to work independently with minimal supervision
- Willing and able to work shift schedules and travel or work out of town as required
- Physically capable of performing fieldwork in all weather conditions
